2024/2025 was a transformative year for Foyle Network Foundation—one of growth, collaboration, and new opportunities to support our community. With more people reaching out for assistance, we remained committed to ensuring the right support was in



place at the right time. This past year, Foyle Network Foundation experienced its busiest year yet—providing food and household support to over 10,000 people.

At the heart of our work is a commitment to listening to and championing the voices of people with lived experience. As an Anti-Poverty Organisation, we believe that real change comes from working alongside those who know the realities of poverty firsthand. Their insights shape our services, ensuring that every initiative—from the launch of The Network, an affordable food shop closer to the City centre, to the publication of The Flight of the Swallows, a book created by members of The Swallows participation group—reflects the needs and aspirations of our community. These milestones stand as a testament to what's possible when lived experience guides meaningful action.

We are grateful to our funders, whose generous support and investment enable us to continue providing vital services. Thanks to funding from the Department for Communities, with additional support from Derry City and Strabane District Council, we secured shop premises on Strand Road to establish The Network. This new initiative extends our support services and is inspired by the insights gained from the Feeding Britain Network, who are also assisting in the operation of the service.

Ongoing support and funding from Trussell has helped us advance our mission to address the underlying reasons people require foodbank support while striving toward a future where foodbanks are no longer needed. Their investment has enabled us to maximise people's income by £425,190.78, working in collaboration with local advice services to provide this crucial financial assistance.

Even in difficult times we were totally overwhelmed with the donations and support we received from the public and businesses. People knew how tough it was for others and wanted to support them where they could, and we are extremely grateful to those who donated.

I want to thank our team at Foyle Network Foundation, the staff, volunteers and board of directors for your commitment and hard work, I have no doubt by working together we will be able to face the challenges and developments of the coming year.



THE SWALLOWS

Foyle Network Foundation recognises the importance of involving people with lived experience to help us improve our service. Over the past year, we have been working closely with our participation group members, known as The Swallows, to create a book of their lived experience stories.

As a food bank in the Trussell Network, we have created a participatory culture where those with lived experience feel seen, heard, valued and empowered. The Swallows decided they wanted to tell their stories, in order to combat stigma. They also wanted to raise awareness of the different support services that Foyle Network Foundation offer, to give others living in poverty a sense of hope.

CAMPAIGNS

School Holiday Food Grant

Following NI Executive cut to School Holiday Food Grant and the impact this cut was having on families, Foyle Network Foundation identified a local campaign issue. We called on the NI Executive to:

- Reinstate the School Holiday Food Grant with an increase to reflect an increase in food costs
- Deliver a budgeted anti-poverty strategy
- Implement the recommendations from the reviews of welfare mitigations and discretionary support
- NI Executive to call on the UK Government to implement an Essentials Guarantee

Harmful Money Lending

A local issue that is driving poverty in Foyle is Harmful Money Lending. Foyle Network Foundation has seen an increase in people who are struggling with rising household costs accessing loans from unreputable bodies and being charged extortionate high interest rates.

In order to respond to this, we set up a Steering Group. Members of the Steering Group are: Community Restorative Justice, APEX, ASK Advice Service, Skeoge Community Hub, Derry, Waterside and Pennyburn Credit Unions.

Christmas can be one of the most stressful times for those facing financial hardship. To promote safe lending and spending, we launched our Christmas Billboard Campaign on 19th November with the support of Mayor Lillian Senoi-Barr.



In February 2025, we hosted an event to raise awareness of this issue and informed over 50 people from a range of statutory and community organisations how Harmful Money Lenders are operating.

Lay it All on the Table

Over the summer we hosted community stalls as part of Trussell's "Guarantee our Essentials" campaign, where we were joined by local elected representatives to discuss the impact of the low rate of Universal Credit.



As part of this stall, members of the public were invited to "lay it all on the table" and tell us what they think of the current benefits system. People shared their opinions by writing on a tablecloth which will be used to lobby the Labour government to implement an Essentials Guarantee and begin reforming the social security system.

The overwhelming consensus from these stalls was that the public felt no one should have to rely on a foodbank.



HOW WE HELPED

Michael self employed father of two children, had to reduce working hours to care for one of his children who has additional needs. We made a referral to ASK advice service, who helped him apply for benefits his family was missing out on. His claim was successful in securing him £1,156 per month.

As well as the fortnightly support, Michael joined the credit union and starting on our savings scheme. Michael said "I have nothing but good words to speak of the Foyle Network Foundation and everyone involved there, went above and beyond for us, they got us into a position now where we are financially able to leave the Foodbank. I will continue to support and save with them in my credit union. They are a much needed and invaluable service in today's world."

"I loved my time at the Foyle Foodbank everyone was so understanding and helpful. Learning to be a single mum of two was a struggle and trying to afford life."

Grace, single mother of four children and carer of parent, recently experienced a bereavement, struggling to make ends meet.

We made a referral to ASK advice service for a benefits review, who made a PIP application. This claim was successful and Grace was awarded £440 per month.Referrals were made to Surestart and family hub, where Grace and her children attended various programmes.

"I am very happy this service exists; I have been treated with respect & dignity."

Grace said "I came to the foodbank to get support with food not expecting to get support with everything else. I was suffering with my mental health & Louise advised me to go to speak to my doctor to tell them how I was feeling. As a result, my medication was reviewed & I was referred to the primary care team. I started attending programmes with Surestart which got me out of the house and talking to other mums.

Ethos family hub supported my older children. We had a great Christmas with the support I received from the foodbank and the other organisations that I was referred to. Going to the foodbank changed my life in unexpected ways. If it hadn't been for Louise encouraging me to get support for my mental health, I would never have made the first step. I wouldn't have gone for a benefits check. I am now in a position where I no longer need to use the foodbank."

"The support and kindness I received was greatly appreciated.
Nobody plans or wants to be in a situation where they need to be at a foodbank but everyone is so welcoming and reassuring. The items and range of products for myself and my children were excellent and was such a great help."

"The Foyle Network shop is brilliant. The variety of food is great, it caters for everyone's needs. The savings on the cost of a family's shopping bill is unbelievable. The staff are always kind and courteous and are very easy to chat to. It's an amazing place with amazing people and I am very grateful it's there"

COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIPS AND PROJECTS

We launched our second Baby Hub at Irish Street Community Centre in collaboration with Waterside Neighbourhood Partnership and Irish Street Community Association, welcoming families from across the Waterside.

Waterside Credit Union signed up babies as new members, alongside parents and other relatives who also became members.

Skeoge Baby Hub continued to experience strong engagement throughout the year, with new parents joining. Babies attending the hub were also registered as members of Pennyburn Credit Union, helping families start their savings and good financial journey.
